General Camp Information

Background

The Danebod Family Camps (pronounced don'ah bo or dan'ah bo) have met since 1948 under the leadership of the campers themselves. Each camper is encouraged to become involved in planning and implementing camp activities. The camps are governed by a volunteer board, which is composed of campers elected from each camp session.

Location

The Danebod Family Camps are held at the Danebod Folk School campus in the southwestern Minnesota town of Tyler. Tyler is located on US Highway 14, with the Danebod Folk School located one block south of US 14.

Beginning and Ending

Camp opens with supper Sunday evening at 5:30 p.m. and closes with breakfast Saturday morning. Plan to arrive early Sunday afternoon, in time to unpack and settle in. Informational activities and campus tours take place as early as 4 p.m. for new campers and campers with children.

Housing and Food

Housing is provided in the Folk School Dormitory and Danebod Lodge, which is close to all activities. You may, if you choose, bring your own camper/trailer or tent which allows the camp to accommodate more people. All campers must bring their own bed linens, blankets, and towels. Upon request, older children may be assigned to room with other children of the same age and sex. All meals, which include some Danish specialties, are prepared by local cooks and served in the lower level Dining Hall of the Dormitory building. Due to pre-camp meal planning, special dietary needs must be requested, and food allergies noted on your registration form in advance of camp start. Tuition costs include all meals, except for local campers who pay per meal.

Young Campers

Campers under college age must be accompanied by a parent or adult sponsor. Young people are the responsibility of their parents or sponsors at all times. Babysitting is provided in the dormitory nightly from 8:00 p.m. to midnight. Parents of young children may wish to organize cooperative babysitting at other times.

Limitations

No pets are permitted at camp. The Danebod campus, including the Dormitory and Lodge, is SMOKE-FREE. Dormitory rooms are on second and third floors; access is by stairs only. The Dining and Lecture halls are wheel-chair accessible by ramp. Only the Dining Hall and Office areas are air conditioned, however dormitory rooms have fans. The Danebod Lodge provides a limited number of easily accessible rooms for campers unable to climb stairs. Room assignments are based on need, and at the discretion of camp director(s).

Register by Mail

Space at Danebod Family Camp is limited, and registration applications are accepted on a first come, first served basis. To reserve a spot in the camp of your choice, please print your registration form (available online at www.DanebodFamilyCamp.org) and mail as soon as possible with your deposit. A deposit of \$40 per person (check or money order) for ALL attendees (except for infants under age 1) must be included to hold your registration. Your canceled check is your registration confirmation and you will pay the balance upon arrival at camp. Tuition balance at camp will be accepted in the form of personal check, money order, cashier's check, and cash, in addition to Debit/Credit cards for a nominal fee. Shortly before camp, you will receive a letter from your camp director. Note: All campers must register by mail – **including resource people** – to ensure room and board for everyone. Camps are not responsible for lost or misplaced submissions.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available to help defray costs. For more information or availability, please contact the director of your desired camp session.

Refund Policy

Refunds of the registration deposit fee will be made if notice of cancellation is received at least 20 days prior to the first day of camp. Please contact the camp director or registrar if you need to cancel your registration.
